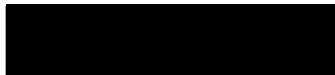

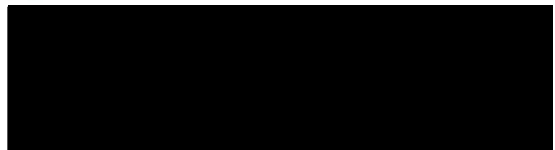

Measure U Argument Against - Jefferson Elementary School Bond

Jefferson Elementary School District wants to borrow \$30,000,000. That would buy a lot of fencing. But their actual law says your money can buy housing for workers, instead! You will pay a tax on your own home so employees can live in District housing.

With interest, the taxpayers will have paid \$61,000,000 by the time those bonds are paid off, around 2047!

This is wrong. Proposition 39 only lets a district borrow for "school facilities", like classrooms. Proposition 39, called "Smaller Classes, Safer Schools and Financial Accountability Act", specifically says no money for "salaries or operating expenses". But some districts are trying this sneaky way around the protection of Proposition 39. They want to pay the teachers with free rent, or low rent, and make the people borrow and pay the interest to do it.

Of course, college professors might live on campus-- but elementary school teachers? Really? How can this work?

How will the District allocate units? Manage them? Make the "house rules"? Does a single teacher get one bedroom? When she has a baby, she gets two? Can she sub-rent rooms? AirBnb them? Have a room for the child of her husband - or her ex-wife? Can she smoke? Marijuana? People have a right to marijuana, today. But parents project their moral standards on elementary teachers. Do you want everybody knowing where the teacher lives? And the District making the rules there? Shouldn't they just pay her in cash and leave her alone?

These bonds must be repaid by Ad Valorem property taxes. In California, the Ad Valorem taxes are very unequal. Some people must pay many times what neighbors pay, for the very same floor plan.

Don't let the District borrow \$30,000,000 in your name.
