Argument Against

Measure II Argument Against - Millbrae Center Bond

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The City of Millbrae received a \$6,200,000 insurance settlement for the destroyed Millbrae Community Center. The proposal to rebuild that requires this bond is a much more grandiose project than envisioned by many in the Millbrae community, who simply want the financially appropriate decision - replacement using the insurance that the City itself deemed appropriate!

Consider the following:

- Millbrae has an average PCI rating of 56 on roads; Millbrae streets are "at risk". The shoddy-condition roads require \$1,500,000 annual maintenance at this point.
- 2016-2017 CAFR shows \$85,600,000 million in long-term debt and \$42,700,000 million in net CalPERS pension obligations. CalPERS lowering their discount rate and accelerating their amortization period means, by all accounts, up-front pension costs will double in the near future. Is Millbrae prepared for this?
- This doesn't include the authorized issuance of \$18,600,000 in Wastewater Revenue Bonds for 2018. Millbrae may need bonds for other infrastructure as well, soon. Does this bond threaten the City's future credit rating and financial flexibility?
- The Millbrae Library had significant cost overruns and delays including a \$1,600,000 settlement with the project's bondholder, Travelers Insurance.
- The City showed a \$6,000,000 funding gap for the Recreation Center under the assumption that private funds could be located later- ask yourself if it is even fiscally responsible to break ground on a capital project without adequate funding identified?

This is the same City Council and staff that felt a budget amendment of \$346,500 for a holiday ice rink before basic city services such as the at-risk roads and local sanitation concerns.

The abhorrent track record Millbrae has demonstrated with fiscal responsibility should motivate anyone to VOTE NO on Measure II
