88	Friday, March 27, 2020	Last day for a local entity to deliver a resolution requesting election services from the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors for the June 23, 2020 Election. EC §§1405(b), 10002, 12001
88	Friday, March 27, 2020	The 10-calendar-day public review period begins March 27, 2020 at 5 p.m. and ends April 6, 2020 at 5 p.m. for all documents filed as of the filing deadline of March 27, 2020. Between these dates, the Elections Official or any registered voter eligible to vote on the contest in question may seek a writ of mandate or injunction requiring any or all of the materials to be amended or deleted if found to be false, misleading, or inconsistent with the Elections Code. 78	Monday, April 6, 2020	
83	Wednesday, April 1, 2020	Last day for an order of election calling for a ballot measure to be amended or withdrawn. A resolution of the legislative body that issued the order of election must be filed with the Elections Official by this date in order to amend or withdraw a ballot measure. EC §9605
82	Thursday, April 2, 2020	The County Elections Official will designate a measure letter at 11 a.m. on this date at the Office of the Registration & Elections Division at 40 Tower Road in San Mateo. EC §13116
81	Friday, April 3, 2020	Primary Arguments in favor of and against local measures are due by 5 p.m. on this date. Such arguments, if already submitted, may be changed until and including this day. EC §§9162-63, 9315-16
81	Friday, April 3, 2020	The 10-calendar-day public review period begins April 3, 2020 at 5 p.m. and ends April 13, 2020 at 5 p.m. for Primary Arguments filed in favor of and against local measures. Between these dates, the Elections Official or any registered voter eligible to vote on the contest in question may seek a writ of mandate or injunction requiring any or all of the materials to be amended or deleted if found to be false, misleading, or inconsistent with the Elections Code. 71	Monday, April 13, 2020	Rebuttal Arguments for measures where a Primary Argument was filed both in favor of and against are due on this date by 5 p.m. Such arguments may be changed until and including this date. EC §§9163, 9167, 9316-17
71	Monday, April 13, 2020	Impartial Analyses for measures are due on this date by 5 p.m. EC §§9160, 9313
71	Monday, April 13, 2020	The 10-calendar-day public review period begins April 13, 2020 at 5 p.m. and ends April 23, 2020 at 5 p.m. for Rebuttal Arguments filed in favor of and/or against local measures and Impartial Analyses. Between these dates, the Elections Official or any registered voter eligible to vote on the contest in question may seek a writ of mandate or injunction requiring any or all of the materials to be amended or deleted if found to be false, misleading, or inconsistent with the Elections Code. 60	Friday, April 24, 2020	Between these dates, the County Elections Official must send ballots and balloting materials to all Military and Overseas Voters who filed ballot applications by May 9, 2020. EC §§300(b), 3105, 3114

40	Thursday, May 14, 2020	First pre-election campaign committee statement for candidates and committees is due for the period ending May 9, 2020 (which is 45 days before the election). GC §84200.8
28	Tuesday, May 26, 2020	Between these dates, Vote by Mail ballots and county Sample Ballot & Official Voter Information Pamphlets will be mailed to all registered voters. Voters interested in having replacement Vote by Mail ballots be mailed to them should make the request by June 16, 2020 to ensure the ballots arrive on or before Election Day. EC §§3001, 4101, 4108 Note: The start of the mailing period falls on a holiday. Date is moved to the next day, May 26, 2020).
7	Tuesday, June 16, 2020	
15	Monday, June 8, 2020	Voter registration closes on this date for the June 23, 2020 Election. Voters must register by this date to be eligible to vote in this election. Voter registration forms postmarked prior to or on this date are accepted. EC §2102
14	Tuesday, June 9, 2020	Processing of Vote by Mail ballots may begin on this date (10 business days before Election Day). Processing Vote by Mail ballots includes opening Vote by Mail ballot return envelopes, removing ballots, duplicating any damaged ballots and preparing the ballots to be machine read, or machine reading them, but under no circumstances may a vote count be accessed or released until 8 p.m. on Election Day. EC §15101(b)
14	Tuesday, Jun 9, 2020	Between these dates, individuals who become new United States citizens on or after June 9, 2020, are eligible to register and vote at the Registration & Elections Division at 40 Tower Road in San Mateo. A new citizen registering during this time must provide proof of citizenship and declare that he or she has established residency in California. EC §§331, 3500, 3501
0	Tuesday, Jun 23, 2020	
14	Tuesday, June 9, 2020	Between these dates, the County Elections Official shall provide Conditional Voter Registration and provisional voting at the Registration & Elections Division at 40 Tower Road in San Mateo for voters who missed the June 8, 2020 deadline. EC §2170-71
0	Tuesday, June 23, 2020	
12	Thursday, June 11, 2020	Second pre-election campaign committee statement for candidates and committees is due for the period ending June 6, 2020 (which is 17 days before the election). GC §84200.8
7	Tuesday, June 16, 2020	Last day for voters to request a replacement Vote by Mail ballot to be mailed to them. EC §3001
0	Tuesday, June 23, 2020	Election Day. EC §§4108, 14212; GC §25210.8
Days Following Election	Date	Action Taken
3	Friday, June 26, 2020	Vote by Mail ballots postmarked on or before Election Day must be received by the County Elections Official by this date in order to be counted. EC §3020, 4103
30	Thursday, July 23, 2020	Last day for the County Elections Official to certify the election results to the jurisdictions participating in the election. EC §15372
