"Measure U" Sales Tax / Rebuttal to Argument "Against"

Silicon Valley Taxpayers is a special interest group outside of Brisbane that will distort information to sow doubt in our community. At least they should get their facts straight.

Passing Measure U, Brisbane will *not* have the highest sales tax in San Mateo County, but instead be exactly the same as our neighboring communities of Daly City, South San Francisco and San Bruno at 9.875%.

Currently our sales tax rate is amongst the lowest in San Mateo County.

That's what happens when a group from outside Brisbane tries to influence you. They don't even know our community.

Measure U was put on the ballot because Brisbane continues to experience an annual shortfall of revenues while costs keep increasing.

Without additional sources of revenue, some programs and activities may need to be cut or scaled back to ensure that **essential** City services continue.

All revenue collected from this modest half-cent sales tax will stay in Brisbane. It will generate approximately \$2M annually and be used to keep Brisbane services funded. This includes our Parks and Rec programs, activities for youth, seniors, and adults, and community events.
