## Argument in Favor of Measure

Vote YES on Measure to maintain City services and infrastructure that make Foster City a great place to live, WORK, and play.

Residents and businesses in Foster City have come to expect a high level of services supported by reliable, high-quality infrastructure. These community characteristics are what help draw businesses to call Foster City home. The rising costs to meet these expectations have outpaced the revenues used to pay for them. Of note is the <u>Business License Tax</u>, the rate for which has not been updated since 1972. Due to the lengthy delay in addressing this revenue source, it has become clear that a more sustainable solution is needed, therefore this measure is being strongly recommended to voters. Since 2016, three of our four main revenue sources have increased between 21% and 67%, while the fourth, our <u>Business License Tax</u> has had a meager revenue increase of 4%. This measure will add about \$1.5 million in revenue annually without impacting the rates for over 94% of our businesses. This updating of our <u>Business License Tax</u> is one step toward the long-term sustainability of the quality of life we enjoy in Foster City.

Your YES vote will strike a balance between the affordability for businesses to call Foster City home and the ability for the City to meet the community expectations that draw those businesses here in the first place.
