

South San Francisco's Business License Tax is regressive and has not been updated since 2008. Currently, small businesses pay over 50% of the tax, and there is a cap that has limited the contribution of the largest corporations.

Meanwhile, California's State budget deficit puts South San Francisco under increasing threat to lose over \$5,000,000 in fiscal year 2025/26. The State has taken millions of property tax dollars from cities to address its own budget deficit, and is threatening to not pay the City back. South V San Francisco needs a locally controlled source of revenue to maintain crucial services our 13 residents depend on. 3

Measure __ seeks to address these two issues through modernizing our Business License Tax. §3

will raise \$2,600,000, with every single dollar invested locally into the South Measure 13 San Francisco community. All funds must stay in South San Francisco for local services and 10 infrastructure, and no funds may be taken away by the State.

Measure does NOT increase taxes on residents.

protects small businesses and makes sure the largest corporations pay their fair share. Measure __ will shift the tax burden away from small businesses, and remove the 25 cap on large corporations. 3.2
