Conditional Voter Registration

Missed the February 18 deadline to register to vote?

You can still vote via Conditional Voter Registration (CVR) at any Vote Center.

What's the process?

1. You will be given a paper ballot and CVR envelope.
2. Register to vote by completing the front of the CVR envelope or submitting a completed registration form.
3. Place the voted ballot in the envelope and deposit both into a Ballot Box. You must vote using a CVR ballot while inside the Vote Center.
4. If you are eligible to vote in San Mateo County and you have not already voted in this election, your CVR ballot will be counted.

COUNTY CHARTER AMENDMENT Shall the measure amending the San Mateo County Charter to grant the Board of Supervisors authority until December 31, 2028 to remove an elected Sheriff from office for cause, including for violation of law related to a Sheriff's duties, flagrant or repeated neglect of duties, misappropriation of public funds, willful falsification of documents, or obstructing an investigation, by a four-fifths vote of the Board of Supervisors, after written notice and an opportunity to be heard, be adopted?

ORDINANCE NO. 4899

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

* * * * *

AN ORDINANCE CALLING FOR A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON MARCH 4, 2025 THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY OF SAN MATEO FOR THE PURPOSE OF VOTING UPON AN AMENDMENT TO THE SAN MATEO COUNTY CHARTER GRANTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS THE AUTHORITY UNTIL DECEMBER 31, 2028 TO REMOVE AN ELECTED SHERIFF FOR CAUSE, BY A FOUR-FIFTHS VOTE OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, AFTER WRITTEN NOTICE AND AN OPPORTUNITY TO BE HEARD, PROCLAIMING SAID SPECIAL LOCAL COUNTYWIDE ELECTION PURSUANT TO ELECTIONS CODE SECTION 12001, AND REQUESTING THAT THE ELECTION BE CONSOLIDATED WITH ANY AND ALL OTHER ELECTIONS TO BE HELD ON MARCH 4, 2025

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, **ORDAINS** as follows:

WHEREAS, the County of San Mateo is one of 14 charter counties in California and has adopted the San Mateo County Charter ("Charter"), which was originally ratified by San Mateo County voters in 1932; and

WHEREAS, under the Charter, the Board of Supervisors ("Board") is the governing body of the County and, in that capacity, has all the powers and duties vested in it by the California Constitution, California general law, and the Charter, including, without limitation, the responsibility to supervise the official conduct of all County officers and employees to ensure they faithfully discharge their duties; and

WHEREAS, the Board does not currently have the authority to remove an elected Sheriff, even in cases where the Sheriff engages in such wrongdoing as the violation of laws relating to their duties, flagrant or repeated neglect of their duties, misappropriation of County funds or property, willful falsification of official statements or documents, and/or obstruction of an official investigation into the conduct of the Sheriff and/or the San Mateo County Sheriff's Office; and

WHEREAS, under the law, a Charter amendment may be proposed by the Board for approval by the voters of San Mateo County at a special election to occur on the next established election date (Cal. Const. Art. 11, § 3; Gov. Code, §§ 23720, 23722; Elec. Code, § 1000); and

WHEREAS, the Board deems it necessary and essential to submit to the qualified voters of San Mateo County the question of a proposed amendment to the Charter which, if approved, would grant the Board authority to remove an elected Sheriff from office, for cause, with a four-fifths vote, after written notice and an opportunity to be heard ("Measure"), at a special election to be held on March 4, 2025, the next established election date under the law.

SECTION 1. CALL OF ELECTION AND PURPOSE.

A special election on the Measure is hereby called, proclaimed, and ordered to be held on March 4, 2025 for the purpose of voting upon a proposed amendment to the Charter.

SECTION 2. FORM OF BALLOT QUESTION

The form of the ballot question for the Measure as it is to appear on the ballot is as follows:

COUNTY CHARTER AMENDMENT

Shall the measure amending the San Mateo County Charter to grant the Board of Supervisors authority until December 31, 2028 to remove an elected Sheriff from office for cause, including for violation of law related to a Sheriff's duties, flagrant or repeated neglect of duties, misappropriation of public funds, willful falsification of documents, or obstructing an investigation, by a four-fifths vote of the Board of Supervisors, after written notice and an opportunity to be heard, be adopted?

SECTION 3. THE MEASURE.

A. The Measure, if approved by voters, would add Section 412.5 to Article IV of the Charter, to read as follows:

412.5. Removal of Elected Sheriff for Cause

- a. The Board of Supervisors may remove a Sheriff from office for cause, by a four-fifths vote, after a Sheriff has been:
 - (1) Served with a written statement of alleged grounds for removal; and
 - (2) Provided a reasonable opportunity to be heard regarding any explanation or defense.
- b. For the purposes of this Section 412.5, "cause" shall mean any of the following:
 - (1) Violation of any law related to the performance of a Sheriff's duties; or
 - (2) Flagrant or repeated neglect of a Sheriff's duties as defined by law; or
 - (3) Misappropriation of public funds or property as defined in California law; or
 - (4) Willful falsification of a relevant official statement or document; or
 - (5) Obstruction, as defined in federal, State, or local law applicable to a Sheriff, of any investigation into the conduct of a Sheriff and/or the San Mateo County Sheriff's Department by any government agency (including the County of San Mateo), office, or commission with jurisdiction to conduct such investigation.
- c. The Board of Supervisors may provide for procedures by which a removal proceeding pursuant to this Section 412.5 shall be conducted.
- d. This Section 412.5 shall not be applied to interfere with the independent and constitutionally and statutorily designated investigative function of a Sheriff.
- e. This Section 412.5 shall sunset and be of no further force and effect as of December 31, 2028 unless extended by voters of San Mateo County.

San Mateo County Charter Amendment Measure

Impartial Analysis of Measure A

B. The Measure will become effective only if submitted to the voters at the Countywide special election on March 4, 2025, and only after approval by a majority (i.e., 50% + 1) of the qualified voters voting in the special election on the Measure.

C. If the Measure passes, the Charter amendment proposed by the Measure will take effect as provided for in Government Code Sections 23713 and 23714.

SECTION 4. LEGAL EFFECT OF INOPERATIVE PROVISIONS.

In the event that the amendment to the Charter contained in the Measure is rendered inoperative because of the actions of any court, legislative, or other body, or for any other reason, the provisions of the Charter in effect on March 4, 2025 will remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5. LEGAL EFFECT OF INVALID PROVISIONS.

If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of the Measure is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable, such invalidity or unenforceability will not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining sections, subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, phrases, or words of Section 412.5 of Article IV of the Charter. The voters of San Mateo County declare that they would have independently adopted each and every section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of the Measure not declared invalid or unenforceable, without regard to whether any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, phrases, or words of Section 412.5 of Article IV of the Charter is declared invalid or unenforceable.

Approval of Measure A (“Measure”) would amend the Charter of the County of San Mateo (“Charter”) to grant the Board of Supervisors (“Board”) authority to remove an elected Sheriff from office for cause, by a four-fifths (4/5) vote of the Board. This Measure was placed on the ballot by ordinance and resolution passed by a majority vote of the Board.

The Charter currently does not give the Board authority to remove an elected Sheriff. This Measure would grant the Board with the authority to remove an elected Sheriff from office for cause after a Sheriff has been served with a written statement of the alleged grounds for removal and provided with a reasonable opportunity to be heard regarding any explanation or defense. The Measure further provides the following grounds as cause to remove an elected Sheriff:

- (1) Violation of any law related to the performance of a Sheriff’s duties;
- (2) Flagrant or repeated neglect of a Sheriff’s duties as defined by law;
- (3) Misappropriation of public funds or property as defined in California law;
- (4) Willful falsification of a relevant official statement or document; or
- (5) Obstruction, as defined in federal, State, or local law applicable to a Sheriff, of any investigation into the conduct of a Sheriff and/or the San Mateo County Sheriff’s Department by any government agency (including the County of San Mateo), office, or commission with jurisdiction to conduct such investigation.

The Board may provide procedures for how to conduct the removal proceedings. If approved by the voters, the removal for cause provisions in Section 412.5 of Article IV of the Charter shall not be applied to interfere with the independent and constitutionally and statutorily designated investigative function of a Sheriff.

The authority granted by this Measure would sunset and be of no further force and effect as of December 31, 2028 unless extended by the voters of San Mateo County.

This Measure requires approval by a majority of the qualified voters voting in the election.

Argument in Favor of Measure A

Vote Yes on Measure A to hold the sheriff accountable. Our public safety is at risk — **we must act now.**

San Mateo County residents deserve leaders who uphold the law, not those who abuse their power. Measure A provides urgent checks and balances on the sheriff's office. With a built-in December 31, 2028 sunset, it is a focused and time-limited solution **to protect our community.**

Vote Yes to allow the Board of Supervisors to remove a sheriff if they commit serious violations of public trust, such as breaking the law, stealing county funds, repeatedly failing to perform official duties, falsifying documents, or obstructing justice.

Measure A responds to an independent investigative report that sustained allegations the current sheriff created a retaliatory and abusive work environment, used racial and homophobic slurs, and effectively handed control of the office to an unqualified individual with whom the sheriff had an inappropriate relationship. **These allegations could lead to millions of dollars in liabilities and lawsuits against our county.**

These actions led to mass resignations. All but one member of the executive leadership team are no longer with the department. Representatives at every level of sworn staff have united to declare no confidence in the sheriff. **How can we trust the sheriff to keep our county safe when the sheriff's own team doesn't?**

Our community deserves better leadership, accountability, and integrity.

Vote Yes on Measure A to provide common-sense checks and balances against the sheriff's unchecked authority.

Vote Yes to establish accountability and oversight for the sheriff, who oversees a \$300 million budget and is entrusted with the safety of our community.

Join San Mateo County residents, members of the sheriff's office, public safety advocates, organized labor, and community leaders in voting yes on Measure A.

There must be consequences if a sheriff violates the law and public trust.

Rebuttal to Argument Against Measure A

Vote YES on Measure A for Accountability

Measure A is our community’s tool to restore accountability and trust by allowing the Board of Supervisors to remove the sheriff for abuse of power, unethical behavior, or gross misconduct.

A 400-page independent report reveals real problems in the sheriff’s office, including:

- **A culture of intimidation:** Staff who challenge the sheriff’s decisions or report misconduct face severe consequences, creating a culture of fear and silencing those who speak up.
- **Conflicts of interest:** The sheriff’s inappropriate relationship with her chief of staff raises grave ethical concerns and undermines the integrity of her leadership.
- **Blatant discrimination:** The sheriff has been caught making racist and homophobic remarks about the very communities she is supposed to protect, eroding trust and perpetuating harm.

Even worse, the sheriff caused the warrantless arrest of sheriff deputy and union president Carlos Tapia, who exposed corruption within the office. A thorough investigation by the district attorney’s office revealed **no legal basis for the arrest**, concluding that Deputy Tapia had **committed no wrongdoing and should never have been arrested and jailed.**

These actions are deliberate attacks on the principles of justice and accountability. The Board needs the power to remove a sheriff if it concludes these problems warrant her removal.

Vote YES on Measure A to restore integrity to the office.

Vote YES on Measure A to protect our community from lies, corruption, and abuse of power.

Vote YES on Measure A to demand leadership that works for us—not against us.

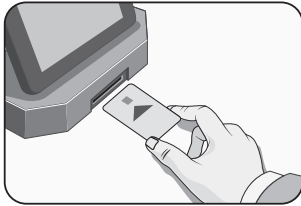
Remote Accessible Vote by Mail (RAVBM) System

Once you have reviewed your selections, touch **“Print Ballot”** and your ballot will print out.

Place your ballot in the **Secrecy Folder** and proceed to the Ballot Box. Deposit your ballot in the Ballot Box. Return the Activation Card and Secrecy Folder to a Vote Center Representative.

Your vote is NOT cast until you place your printed ballot in the Ballot Box.
