A rebuttal argument shall not be accepted unless accompanied by this completed form, which shall contain the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the person(s) submitting it or, if submitted on behalf of a bona fide association of citizens/organization, the name of the association/organization and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers.

Word count limit for Rebuttal Arguments = 250

The rebuttal arguments shall be submitted to the elections official conducting the election no later than Aug 29, 2016

These rules apply to all rebuttal arguments unless a rebuttal argument is otherwise provided by law.

- It will not provide any more funds for affordable housing than they're using now since it will take effect until 2024. 16
- Sales tax revenue go to the general fund and use is prioritized by the Board of Supervisors. 15

- Measure A was originally sold as a TEMPORARY increase to the sales tax for a ten-year period. 16
